Internship Description and Duties:	 Clark Scholars Program Onboarding and Community- Building Conduct an internal scan of the Foundation and its eleven university partners to index and gauge the effectiveness of the onboarding resources and programming used to help new Clark Scholars learn about the program and build a sense of community. Develop a protocol for and conduct informational interviews with the Program Directors and support staff of Clark Scholars Programs at each university to understand: The strengths of and gaps in current onboarding materials; and





 How the Foundation could improve on resources it provides to partner schools Develop an interview protocol and conduct interviews of current and alumni Clark Scholars to understand: How to share the value of the program with prospective Clark Scholars beyond the financial aid support How well Clark Scholars understand the purpose of the program, why they were chosen for the program, and how the program components tie to Mr. Clark's story and philanthropy; What new information would be useful for Scholars when talking about the program in interviews to support their career exploration; How the Foundation and its university partners can best create, support and maintain a sense of community among alumni. Collaborate with Operations team and the Director of Engineering Initiative to review and apply feedback from the May 2021 Clark Scholar Alumni Survey Research best practices in onboarding and community-building among comparable higher education scholarship programs.
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Description of long-term project the Impact Intern will lead or substantively contribute to:	All the work completed by the Impact Intern will contribute to the Clark Foundation's programs long-term. The onboarding and community building work will influence the Clark Scholars Program in perpetuity. It will provide the structure and content that university partners will use every year as they welcome new students and staff to the program. The Maryland Promise Program Survey will be launched after its design in academic year 21-22. It will be distributed each year so the Foundation can compare data year over year.
