Represented on the board is a diverse group of individuals representing sectors such as education, business, homeowner associations, as well as local and federal government agencies. We need the perspective of young professionals, many of whom choose to live in the White Oak area of Montgomery County (east county) because of more affordable housing, proximity to downtown Silver Spring and the northern Prince George's County areas of Laurel and College Park, not to mention a new bus rapid transit system and access to the I-495 beltway. An intern will serve as our first "voice" in representing the young professional demographic and identifying methods of further engagement of more young adults.

Friends of White Oak (FOWO) expects an intern to:

- Research and draft strategies for urban development and renewal, creating brief case studies based on the research available from other communities around the country (we will help identify some communities to begin research)
- Assist in gathering the background and qualifications of a new formed volunteer advisory committee by created a biographical packet based on resumes, LinkedIn profiles, and personal interviews
- Provide feedback and support in improving or expanding the website and communicate changes to the web designer.
- Establish key social media platforms such as Facebook and Twitter and create the content that will attract and engage community members. The intern will be responsible for following the appropriate businesses and civic associations located in the White Oak community. The intern will also demonstrate the tasks we need to maintain beyond the intern period, such as how to track impressions and impact of social media and website hits.
- Extract community photographs from reports we have commissioned regarding the redevelopment of White Oak and use in more social media. The intern will be able to create a strategy for community engagement and execute that strategy that increases online interaction by citizens and businesses, that



|  | ultimately results in more engagement with the FOWO meetings and events.  Develop a library of development projects in the White Oak community, interacting with developers, construction firms, area businesses and civic leaders. The contents of the library will find a home on the website of the FOWO, providing public recognition for the intern.  Interact with area stakeholders include public safety officials, planning board members, county government liaison staff, leadership of homeowner associations to establish a channel of communication to learn more about their needs, concerns, and recommendations for the White Oak community. Create a method of communication that includes a format for registering individuals for a mailing list that can be used for outreach.   |

The Impact Intern will be helping to shape the direction, determine key stakeholders through recommendations and define the protocols we will use in growing the association and its action plan. The resources developed by the Impact Intern will be used in our ongoing management and benchmarking for the future. It is expected that by the end of the internship, the FOWO will have established a short-term strategic plan, and the intern will be an instrumental part of the discussions and decision making for that plan of action.
