The Summer Intern works remotely, mostly as part of a
specific Working Group with 2-3 other interns, and one
staff supervisor, to plan and implement community
development projects (for participants in Ecuador) and
operations of the nonprofit organization. During the
application and interview process, interns can request 1-3
work areas from this list: teaching and practicing English
with adults or kids, microloan reporting, educating kids in
science and arts, planning & assisting a youth virtual camp,
planning mental health awareness seminars for adults,
recruiting long-term U.S. volunteers for service in Ecuador,
community program evaluation & metrics, fundraising and
grant research, and social media communications. The final



	work projects for the successful candidate will be specified in the internship position offer. For example, interns in our English program Working Group will help develop lesson plans, assist an MPI teacher during live classes with students in Ecuador, and pick topics and then participate in group conversation practice for Ecuador adults. Interns will receive 1:1 mentoring, cultural exchange with
	an Ecuador resident, and training in Leadership skills and International Community Impact skills.
